PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Season 1991/92 was a year of consolidation for the Club.

The immediate playing future of our senior sides was a cause of great concern at the end of the 1990/91 season. Facing the prospect of relegation to "B Grade", representations were made to the R.D.C.A. and the Club's retention in "A Grade" was secured. I sincerely believe that this was the correct decision for the Club and R.D.C.A. cricket.

A priority for the Club was the appointment of a senior Coach. Fortunately, we gained the services of Scott Simmonds, a highly respected player within the R.D.C.A. Individually, Scott had a tremendous season which included two centuries. As captain/coach it was a learning experience for him and I consider that it has given him more valuable experience which will benefit us in the future. Well done Scott - a great effort.

On the senior playing side, the Club recruited a number of good experienced players and also attracted many ex-players back to the playing ranks. Basically all senior sides had encouraging performances up to the Christmas break, but only the Fourth XI and Sixth XI were able to reach the finals. Despite spirited and competitive displays, both sides missed out in hard-fought semi-finals. There were many encouraging performances from the senior players, particularly from the younger members. Players like Jason Disney, Simon Denton, Sean Meehan, Dean Morrison and David Parker were consistent performers. With some selective recruiting for next season, the prospect of finals appearances will be very high.

From the junior viewpoint, yet another premiership was achieved. Our Under 16/4 side displayed consistent performances all season and rightfully deserved their convincing win in the grand final. The Under 12/1 side did everything right in the home and away games but were unfortunately beaten in the semi-final. The other sides tried hard and always gave their best. The Club is blessed with many talented junior players and I hope that they will be an important part of the Club for many years to come.

Prior to the commencement of the season, synthetic wickets were laid at Templeton and Milpera Reserves. This put a strain on Club finances, but we struggled on regardless.

A mezzanine floor was also constructed in the Committee room. A great deal of thanks goes to Ron Lovett and the Wantirna Football Club, particularly John Blanck and Gary Lear. This has assisted both clubs with their storage problems.

At the end of the season, Knox Council completed further drainage work at Templeton Reserve. This should further improve the condition of the oval. The Club is hoping that the kerb and channelwork will be completed at Templeton Reserve during

1992/93 works program.

Our social activities were enjoyable and generally successful, despite the numbers being light on for some events. The presentation nights were well attended and a fine way to farewell the season. As a great deal of work goes into the planning of all social events, I urge all Club members to give them priority in attendance and participation. I congratulate Martin Wood, Brett Keys and all the others who assisted on the social scene, particularly the ladies that ran the canteen of a Saturday night.

Sponsorship played an important part in providing funds for the Club during last season. Our sponsors have supported the Club and deserve the continuing patronage of all Club members now and in the future.

A former Club Coach and First XI Captain has announced his retirement from competitive cricket. Our Club owes a great vote of thanks to Pieter Bergshoeff. All the best to Pieter and family in the future.

I congratulate all trophy winners, particularly R.D.C.A. winners and the Under 16/4 premiership team.

I thank the Executive Committee members, and Sub-Committees, for their hard work and support during the season. With the election of positions at the Annual General Meeting, it will be an opportunity for other Club members to guide the path in the future.

My wife Andrea has given me total support in my nine years on the Executive Committee, particularly the last two seasons as President. This has made my job much easier. Thankyou.

A2 REPORT

At the commencement of season 1991/92 the Executive Committee appointed Barry McClure Captain of the Second XI. After Christmas though, Barry was caught up in the processes of looking for, and moving to, a new home. Apart from his junior commitments, Barry felt there was little time left to devote to his A2 charges. As a result I took over the reins until the end of the season.

The season certainly started very successfully, with an outright against Chirnside Park, but a mid-season slump saw us narrowly miss a finals berth. This was disappointing considering we had either beaten sides above us or been competitive against them. Some players, though, need to consider their approach to the game, especially against lower teams, in order to be a serious finals contender.

There were several positive aspects coming out of the season. Overall our bowling attack was very good - possibly the best in A2, only let down by some wayward fielding or missed catches. Such was the nature of the attack that not many thirds bowlers were able to break into our side even though bowling well in their grade. A typical example was Justin Morgan who, although only managing one game, bowled extremely well and was unlucky that Dean Morrison (our main strike bowler) had to return the next game.

On the batting side a number of players showed either responsibility or a growing maturity in their approach. Sean Meehan and Brian Chesterman were very solid and fairly reliable as an opening combination. Gary Grace showed, with a little hard work, that he could make a handy hard-hitting middle-order batsman. David Parker appeared to be learning the value of not trying to hit the cover off each ball and hitting through the line of the ball.

Although basically this was a satisfactory season it can be improved such that we are considered very competitive and a finals contender. This can be brought about in a number of ways for various players. A more serious and dedicated approach is required on the training track to refine batting, bowling or catching skills. A more professional approach to both pre-match warmups and their attitude during the game will also lift the standard for all concerned.

Many of the younger players, with a little more application as suggested above, have the makings to play higher grade cricket in addition to thoroughly enjoying their Saturday afternoon game. Hopefully though this coming season can be improved upon to enable us to have better success.
